The International Society of Geospatial Health (GnosisGIS) organized a thematic Symposium titled "GIS and modelling in parasitology" at

the 12th European Multicolloquium of Parasitology (EMOP XII, Turku, Finland 20-24 July 2016) organized by the European Federation of Parasitologists and the Scandinavian-Baltic Society for Parasitology. The EMOP theme for this year was "Parasites are Forever" pointing both to the history as well as to the future of parasitology.
